Donations are altruistic, confidential, and are performed under strict compliance with current regulations. To become a donor of samples and/or data for biomedical research, you must be registered with the Andalusian Registry of Donors for Biomedical Research by providing your identification data and a description of your state of health. The Andalusian Public Health System Biobank (SSPA) is a network of units that is dependent on the Ministry of Health of the Junta de Andalucía. By employing a network operation, a common ethical framework, a single organizational structure, and decentralized activities, the Research Area of the SSPA Biobank is able to integrate with every public health centre, cell line bank, and other public centres that can obtain, process, preserve, or provide cells, tissues, liquids, substances, and biological samples of clinical origin for research use. Such centres are considered to be nodes of the Biobank.

Our purpose is to support and promote the development of biomedical research by the SSPA's research staff and at other institutions by providing biological samples and their associated data that are needed to perform research projects while ensuring compliance with legal, ethical, and quality requirements. The Biobank also provides support for teaching activities in the field of Health Sciences.

The Andalusian Registry of Donors for Biomedical Research is integrated into the Research Area of the SSPA Biobank, thus allowing Andalusians to participate directly in the development of research by donating biological samples of human origin, including blood, tears, saliva, hair, nails, faeces, urine, and sweat, for example.
